
SUPPLEMENTARY QUESTION

**Government Consultation:
Planning for the Right Homes in the Right Places**

On the 14 September 2017, the Government published *Planning for the right homes in the right places: consultation proposals*. This seeks views on proposals to change national planning policy in a number of ways with regard to plan-making including introducing a standard approach to calculating housing need; arrangements for working together to meet housing needs across local authority boundaries; calculating the housing needs of particular groups in society and to support neighbourhood planning; and assessing viability.

The consultation proposes transitional arrangements. For plans currently subject to examination, the proposal is to continue with the approach to calculating housing need under current national policy and guidance.
