

Appendix III: Site appraisal criteria

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Approach to site options appraisal


The large number of site options involved necessitated development of a bespoke methodology. It was not possible to simply apply the SA framework (i.e. the list of topics, issues and objectives) established through scoping. The framework, whilst suitable for appraising alternative / draft policy approaches, is not suited for appraising a large number of site options.

As such the site options methodology is essentially a list of 'criteria' developed to reflect the SA framework as closely as possible. The criteria are mainly location / distance related and hence it was possible to use Geographical Information Systems (GIS) software to provide a likely indication of sustainability performance.

Site assessment criteria

The criteria have been grouped by the SA Objectives previously development for the SA process. They have also been colour coded according to each 'sieve' of assessment. Sieve 1 criteria are those which may have fundamental constraints to development e.g. proximity to a European biodiversity site. Sieve 2 criteria are those which may pose a significant constraint to site development. Sieve 3 criteria are these that should be considered in site development but may not be a significant constraint. Please note that none of these criteria, and their scoring necessarily prohibits a site from begin allocated or being taken forward.
